The Sønderjylland #10 President Debbie Cruger-Hansen is sending the following message to our members: I hope all of you are well and coping with our new normal during this difficult time of the COVID-19 outbreaks in our area, our country, and in the world.

As we explained in our last newsletter, we cancelled our meetings until further notice because of the outbreak. It is unfortunate that we have to take this action, but having our meetings would put our members in unnecessary danger of being infected with the COVID-19 virus. Better safe than sorry.

So far, I have not heard of any of our members getting sick with the virus, thank goodness, but please do let me know if you need any help or if you know of any of our members who need help.

Here is an update on how the Cruger-Hansen clan is coping.

I am getting used to teaching my 4th grade class on-line, remote learning we call it. Our school campus is closed and all our students were authorized to take the school supplied Chromebook tablets home with them and use them for remote learning. I now have daily "meetings" via ZOOM with my students, small groups. We read books with each other and discuss the book afterwards, like a book report, but much more in person with their teacher, (me). We also do art and other projects. My co-teacher in 4th grade teaches math and science to the students in the same manner via ZOOM.

I seem to be working harder now, (from home) than I ever did in the classroom at school. I am struggling to keep my students engaged and on task, but thankfully, I have a great principal, and I work for a very understanding School District. We have to last until summer vacation in June, and I am sure we will. My husband John, (your secretary/treasurer) supplies me with coffee and prepares meals for us, a great relief.

John is in contact with his family and friends in Denmark. They are in the same situation we are in, staying home sheltering in place. Denmark has lifted some restrictions, but very few people are willing to take a chance and leave home, especially the older population. John's cousin's son-in-law is a doctor at the main hospital in Denmark, Rigshospitalet, and he stays at the hospital for three days at a time, not going home to his family, in order to protect them from the virus. The outbreak in Denmark is not as bad as here fortunately, but they still are in danger. It's different in Sweden, just across the bridge from Copenhagen. John's childhood friend's children live in Malmø, Sweden, but they decided to take the Danish lead and shelter in place even though it is not required. Sweden has nearly twice the number of infected and dead from COVID-19 than Denmark, based on percentage of population.

Kirsten is busy homeschooling William, 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and Henry, Kindergarten. Fortunately for the boys, (or maybe not) Kirsten was a 6<sup>th</sup> grade teacher for years (before kids), and had just returned to be a substitute teacher when COVID-19 closed the schools. The boys can't claim mom doesn't know what they are supposed to do. Elle just turned two, so her learning is fast and furious since she has both parents, and especially her brothers there all day to learn from.

Catherine is at home, telecommuting to her job at BioMarin Pharmaceuticals in Novato. She is doing ok, but is missing collaborating in person with her coworkers. Caroline is distributing the school lunches, (actually breakfast, lunch and dinner), that our School District supplies to all persons under seventeen. She also, as the school's 8th grade counselor, is in contact with her students both on-line and by phone, checking in on them as to their studies and how she can help in other ways. After school she takes walks in her neighborhood with her dog "Pupster" that many of you know. It's a different way of life for a school counselor for sure. # **History**

There has been a lot of talk about the 1918-19 Spanish Flu pandemic in the news lately so I thought I would look at what Dania and Dannebrog were doing during this time. On April 22<sup>nd</sup> through the 27<sup>th</sup> of 1919 the Convention was held in Modesto. Some of the Business that took place was a resolution calling upon the peace conference to restore Schleswig to Denmark. They appointed a committee to investigate and plan for establishing a home for Old members of Dania. Later to become Aldersly. By unanimous vote, the sum of \$1,000.00 was subscribed for Victory bonds. It was reported that we had 2,400 Members, that we paid \$4,300 out that year in death benefits and \$11,000 in Sick benefits. It did not mention if it was related to the Flu, but during this time it was normally around \$12,000.0 a year. After all those expenses we still had a reported \$141,300.77 in our combined

At the Convention a new Branch of Dannebrog was formed, Alfa #14 of Modesto. It was also very common for local Branches to be purchasing Victory bonds and being involved in fund raising for them.

In 1918 at the installation in Salinas the Grand President was Kidnapped. According to the news article there was about one Hundred visitors from San Jose, Hayward and San Francisco. They also initiated a New member into Freja #6. The Installation was conducted by Grand President and member of Freja J. T. Lund. He was assisted

by Grand Vice Marshal Vijby of Hayward. The Meeting was for the members of the lodge only, which means that only men were to be present. However, the wives of the Freja members, many of them were members of Fremad Lodge, ruled otherwise. They secured admittance into the hall with the aid of a I.O.O.F Hall Manager while the meeting was in progress. By clever maneuvering, the Ladies captured the Grand President, and then sent an ultimatum to the Freja member that they would release the high officer of the Grand Lodge when they were admitted to the session. The Grand President being surrounded by forty ladies, had little chance to escape. The men held a hurried conference among themselves and realizing the position in which they had been placed by the adroit capture, and knowing he was indispensable to the continuance of the Lodge business they capitulated and admitted the ladies. Fremad Lodge was the Ladies' auxiliary for Freja #6.

In this same I.O.O.F Hall in September of 1919 a funeral was held for Past Grand President Carl Rasmussen who had passed away due to an illness contracted during the "flu" period a year ago. Carl served as Jr. Past Grand President from 1905 till 1907 due to the 1906 earthquake just like this year. He is also the only Grand Officer that I have been able to find who succumbed to the Spanish Flu. Let us make sure we do not lose anyone during this Covid-19 pandemic.
