Because the COVID-19 outbreak doesn't seem to have diminished in our area in any significant manner, we will continue, until further notice, to cancel our scheduled meetings for year 2020 and in to the 2021 year. It is unfortunate that we have to take this action, but having our meetings would put our members in unnecessary danger of being infected with the COVID-19 virus. Better safe than sorry.

We hope all of you are well and coping during this difficult time.

So far, we have not heard of any of our members getting sick with the virus, thank goodness, but please do let us know if you need any help or if you know of any of our members who need help.

In addition to the COVID-19 virus, we are also dealing with wildfires and the smoke affecting all of us.

On a personal note, President Debbie and I, (Secretary

John) have been sheltering away from the Bay Area since late May and are now planning to return to our home in El Cerrito on October 4 and stay there as long as we feel it is

safe for us. Debbie and I will celebrate our 40th wedding anniversary on October 18 and wanted to be home with our girls to celebrate.

We are fortunate to have a vacation home in Lassen County, in the town of Clear Creek, (population 400, elevation 4,980 feet) less than a mile from the Plumas County line. Plumas County, where there, so far, have been only 50 cases of COVID-19 since March, is the only County in California which actually publishes daily what area of the county (cities) the COVID-19 cases were in, and which cases are currently infectious and which cases are considered over (no longer infectious). That has been a great comfort to us, since we then could avoid the city where the active cases were, while they still were infectious.

We have however, from time to time, been severely affected by the forest fire smoke, to the point where we had to stay indoors for nearly two weeks straight. We also had our power turned off for two days by PG&E which was an inconvenience since our home is all electric. Debbie has been teaching remotely since mid-August and when the power was shut off she lost her internet connection during a ZOOM meeting with her class. We raced to the nearest town, (Westwood), 4 miles from our

house since Westwood is not on PG&E's grid and did not lose power. We sat in our Chrysler Pacifica Plug-in Electric van for nearly 6 hours a day, for two days, connected to our T-Mobile hotspot and the laptop computer plugged in to the van's 110-volt outlet, having ZOOM meetings and otherwise teaching class. Thank goodness the van has a 300-volt 16 Mega-Watt storage battery that can run the hotspot and Debbie's laptop for days without depleting more than a few percent of the battery. We actually parked in front of the local coffeeshop, (which was open for business) so I could keep Debbie supplied with hot Latte's during this ordeal. That's the life of a Fourth-Grade teacher, teaching remotely nowadays.

Hopefully these inconveniences from the fires and power shutdowns are short term. However, the health effects from the heavy smoke almost everywhere can be very dangerous, so please stay out of the smoke.
